NEW DOCLINE –

To access New Docline go to newdocline.docline.gov to login, select social Login/openID, select Google

If your institution blocks the site, try using “Citrix Intranet” as your browser if available.

Docline-L is inundating our emails with issues/problems regarding NEW DOCLINE. The following are just a few examples: (NOTE: It is possible that these and other issues have, or will be, resolved by NLM)

- Problems for some accessing New Docline
- Without entering a PMID # the request process is more cumbersome
- Some complain font size is too small, especially for the Docline #
- No notice if you borrow a title already in your Serhold
- The Borrow receipt does not show the library group to which the lender belongs (which is important for statistics)

LINKOUT

Linkout's free Submission Utility feature, for libraries to link directly from PubMed citations to their library's online full-text subscriptions and local print holdings records, **is being discontinued**. **By year end 2019 NLM is requiring all libraries transition to Linkout's Outside Tool instead. This requires the purchase of a commercial link resolver** and can be a costly and unanticipated/unbudgeted expense for libraries.

Some link resolvers are: 360 Link (ProQuest), Full-Text Finder (Ebsco), TDNet, Ovid's link resolver, SFX (ExLibris)
